ANNUAL REPORT (2022-23)



Every year we participate in the Mumbai University Youth Festival, and various intercollegiate festivals. Our year starts with the preparations for Mumbai University Youth Festival.
- This year our students participated in University Youth Festival. 





exposure to various units and got feedback for their products/services.







On 21st September 2022, the session was held for students and on 22nd September the session was held for the staff members.

Dr. Shifa Dalwai from SRV Hospital addressed the audience and gave a background on Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation. They made the audience aware of the concept of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation with PPT presentations and Video clips.

They explained the difference between cardiac arrest and Heart attack, the causes, and the steps of first aid.

A training session was also provided during the session with the help of a mannequin they showed a live presentation for better understanding.

The audience got a live experience of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation therapy and the steps for first aid.

College non-teaching staff, support staff, and security attended fire safety training under the direction of Health and Safety. A fire Drill was conducted on 14th July 2022 at the stilt area of the institution.



Aftermath Of Covid And The Behaviour Of People To Cope With It

Abstract: - The main aim of the research will let you know how the situation was faced by all the rich and poor people during the time of the Pandemic Covid-19. Covid-19 is a pathogenic virus. This pandemic has impacted so powerfully in all the fields of the globe like the economy, physical, mental well-being of people, and livelihood. Perhaps the pandemic has reminded us of this fundamental reality of life. The obligation is to save every human life.

Preventions: Oxygen cylinders, Masks, Sanitizer, Quarantine facilities, etc

Introduction: The outbreak of Covid-19 leads to mutations and recombined behavior causing respiratory, enteric, hepatic, and neurologic disease. Basically, covid-19 has a total of seven strains which includes HKU1, NL63, 229E, OC43, SARS-Cov, MERS-COV, and SARS-Cov-2. The first four had a mild impact on humans and the other three caused a fatal impact on humankind. Covid-19 is caused by SARS-Cov-2 which leads to Severe Acute Respiratory Syndrome Coronavirus 2 which includes five variants {Alpha, Beta, Gamma, Delta, and Omicron} these mixtures of variants are formed as a Coronavirus.

Alpha: The first variant Alpha {B.1.1.7} evolved mutations that more efficiently suppress the immune system of the body which is more dangerous and leads to an earlier response of the virus into the cells more effectively.

Beta: The second variant Beta {B.1.351}. Beta also carries a mutation which is known as N501Y which is more contagious and easier to spread and the part that gains the virus strains enter human cells very easily.

Gamma: The third variant Gamma {P.1} has some of the same mutations of Alpha and Beta variants which are transmissible very easily in the human body.

Delta: The fourth variant Delta {B.1.617.2} this strain could make a person sicker than the original virus. Delta is 50% faster than the Alpha variant and 50% more contagious than the original strain SARS-Cov-2. Delta strain is more transmissible to 3-4 persons at a time.

Omicron: This variant {B.1.1.529} has many mutations, some of which are concerning. This variant has also arrived as a third-wave strain

Omicron mutations are on the virus spike protein which has a high probability to get infected as fast

in the human body. The vaccines and booster doses were the best-protecting vaccines for omicron variants.






Guidelines / Preventions:


- To control the pandemic Covid-19 the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare take the initiative to restrict all international travellers from entering the country.
- MOHFW had also proposed various interventions such as social distancing to avoid many more cases.
- On 22nd March, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced 14 hours of Janta Curfew in India.
- From 24th March the first phase of the lockdown started in parks, railway stations, workplaces, and mobility in grocery.
- The second phase of lockdown was extended from 3rd May to 17th May to get the effective results of social distancing and self-quarantine.
- WHO instructed some of the practices like regular hand washing with sanitizer or soap or water, avoiding crowded or gathering places, also avoid touching eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Also, the Healthcare system was struggling/ coping as there was a rapid growth of cases which led to a shortage of hospital beds, oxygen cylinders, and other essential supplies.
- The first covid vaccine was developed by covid vaccine manufacturer Bharat Biotech International which was Covaxin. The second vaccine Covidshield was manufactured by the Serum Institute of India. The third vaccine, Sputnik, was created by Russian scientists from Gamaleya Research Institute.
- As there were a total of 9 vaccines but majorly 3 vaccines were approved.

Recently, after the Nirbhaya case where a non-medical student was raped and brutally murdered in Delhi, the government passed the Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act, 2015. (Care and Protection of Children) Act 2000 reduced the age of sentencing of juveniles for this offense from 18 to 16.

Conclusion: If we want to achieve true empowerment of women, we need to overcome male success and patriarchal mentality. Women should have equal opportunities for education and employment without any discrimination. Providing legal and constitutional rights to women is not enough without changing society's attitude toward women.

Indian Education System

Introduction

With more than 1.5 million schools, 8.5 million teachers, and 250 million children, India's education system is the largest in the world. India's education system is, along with China's, the most complex education system in the world.

India has 760 universities and 38,498 colleges. We are a beautiful young country. Half of India's population is under 25 years of age.

The average age in India is 29 years. In fact, there are 226 million Indians looking at the age group of 10-19 years who are ready for higher education or higher education in other countries.

Therefore, young, productive, and dynamic people are ready to work and change the world.

History of the Indian Education System

The history of the Indian education system is synonymous with the Gurukul system. In ancient times there was Guru (teacher) and Shishya (student). At that time the disciple was expected to assist the master in all daily tasks as part of one's education. Students were taught by gurus (teachers) a whole range of subjects from Sanskrit to scriptures and from mathematics to metaphysics. This ancient system of education in India continued for years until the modern education system came into the picture in the nineteenth century.

Modern Education System

The modern education system was introduced in our country during the British period by Lord Thomas Babington Macaulay in the early 19th century. That education system was based on examination and a well-defined curriculum that gave importance to subjects like science and mathematics and took a back seat to subjects like philosophy and metaphysics.

The education system in India follows the 10+2+3 pattern. But it can be replaced by new education 5+3+3+4 as "National Education".

Policy 2020" which was approved by the government on 29 July 2020. The current education system is divided into pre-primary, primary, primary secondary education, and higher education.

Focused on the Modern Education System

Gurukuls were replaced by brick-and-mortar classrooms. The essence of the guru-disciple bond was lost in the more formal relationship between teacher and student. Examinations are conducted at frequent intervals to test the learning and understanding abilities of the students.

Now the focus of the education system has shifted from learning to memorizing concepts to get good marks in exams. Now instead of understanding the basic concepts the students started breaking the lesson. Now the educated class in India does not know the difference between educated and acting educated.

Various Boards in India

Uttar Pradesh Board of High School and Intermediate Education was the first board in India. Later, the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and Indian Certificate of Secondary Education (ICSE) were established. In addition to the above national-level boards, each state has a state board.

For distance education, there is the National Institute of Open Schooling (NIOS) under the Central Government of India.

The Role of the Ministry of HRD

Institutions of higher education in India are universities, colleges, private (state) universities, and colleges and universities. Higher education is regulated by the University Grants Council (UGC), which plays an important role in monitoring higher education, funding allocation and university accreditation. The National Accreditation and Assessment Council (NAAC) is an assessment and rating body for colleges and universities. In addition, the All-India Council for Technical Education (AICTE) was established to deal with various aspects of technical and vocational education.

The Role of the Private Sector

There are many private schools and colleges in India. It is developing rapidly in the country, but the results have been unsatisfactory. It is because students' study only to score and memorize rather than to learn and understand the concepts.

Students aim for scores and rank to get admission to higher education, which hinders them from acquiring basic knowledge.

The entry of the private sector into this segment has spurred investment of money as well as infrastructure like AC classrooms, well-equipped buildings etc. The scenario of education has completely changed and these days education has become more commercialized.

Downside of Higher Education

India has the third largest education system in the world after China and the United States. It has many educational institutions. This is a fact that casts doubt on the quality and relevance of Indian education. High fees for schools and colleges force parents to take loans to complete further studies.

According to market experts, the Caliber of Indian professionals is very low compared to their counterparts. Indian institutions also lag in research funding and internationalization. Only a few higher educa-

tion institutions are globally recognized due to less focus on research and internationalization.

Many schools, colleges, and institutions are running without proper infrastructure and basic facilities like libraries, hostels, sports, etc. Higher educational institutions have poor-quality curricula, that are not updated and not applicable.

So, he must face many problems. Many students remain jobless due to less collaboration of higher educational institutions with industries.

Education - it needs to change

It needs change because learning is when you can successfully apply what you learn. Education should be such that it builds 'human' good character, builds good thoughts. If you learn 4-5 good ideas and try to cultivate them, your learning will be better than learning a whole library.

But our entire system lacks this. That is why our education system needs major changes. So, we need to learn real-world skills, soft skills, application of what we learn, interest identification, process thinking, and independent thinking. We need to have some professional education in the system.

Workshops should be organized on a regular basis to keep the teachers updated about the latest developments in the field of education. Sometimes extracurriculars should be created according to the current needs of education.

Lakhs of engineers and professionals pass out every year but only a fraction of students get jobs. That's because of the huge skill gap. Our examination system is responsible for this. Private colleges and universities are focused on getting more students who are least interested in the quality of their education. So, there are these kinds of changes.

Summary

Education is a holistic process that should focus on holistic physical, emotional, and social development. The student should be able to contribute to economic and social development. We must not forget that the purpose of education is not to get degrees and certificates but to understand the importance of good education.

We must teach our children that education is not a tool for making money, but a way to develop self-confidence and use it for the development of the country. Therefore, we should think carefully rather than stuffing and compacting. By preserving all these we can make Indian education better and make our country ahead of the world.

शैक्षणिक संरचनेत बदल (NEP)

2030 पर्यंत धोरणात्मक उपक्रम साध्य करण्याच्या उद्देशाने भारत सरकारने नवीन शैक्षणिक धोरण तयार केले आहे. हे सध्याच्या शैक्षणिक धोरणातील संपूर्ण बदल आहे जे 1986 मध्ये शेवटचे लागू करण्यात आले होते. ते मुलांच्या स्वयं-क्षमतेवर आणि संकल्पनेवर आधारित आहे. शिकणे, रॉट लर्निंग प्रक्रियेऐवजी.

राष्ट्रीय शैक्षणिक धोरणाची चौकट सध्याचे धोरण राष्ट्रीय शैक्षणिक धोरण 1986 ची जागा घेते.

नवीन शैक्षणिक धोरणाबाबत चर्चा जानेवारी 2015 मध्ये कॅबिनेट सचिव TSR सुब्रमण्यन यांच्या नेतृत्वाखाली समितीने सुरू केली होती आणि समितीने 2017 मध्ये अहवाल सादर केला होता.

2017 च्या अहवालाच्या आधारे तयार करण्यात आलेल्या राष्ट्रीय शैक्षणिक धोरणाचा मसुदा 2019 मध्ये इस्रो (भारतीय अंतराळ संशोधन संस्था) चे माजी प्रमुख कृष्णस्वामी कस्तुरीरंगन यांच्या नेतृत्वाखालील नवीन टीमने सादर केला होता.

लोक आणि भागधारकांशी सल्लामसलत केल्यानंतर मनुष्यबळ विकास मंत्रालयाने नवीन शैक्षणिक धोरणाचा मसुदा जाहीर केला. त्यानंतर 29 जुलै 2020 रोजी नवीन शैक्षणिक धोरण अस्तित्वात आले.

नवीन शैक्षणिक धोरणातील संरचनात्मक परिवर्तने शालेय शिक्षण 10+2 मॉड्यूल 5+3+3+4 मॉडेलने बदलले आहे. अंमलबजावणी खालीलप्रमाणे केली जाईल: पाया भूत टप्पा - यात तीन वर्षांच्या प्री-स्कूलिंग कालावधीचा समावेश असेल. तयारीचा टप्पा - यात 8-11 वर्षे वयोगटातील 3-5 वर्ग असतात.

मधला टप्पा - 11-14 वर्षे वयोगटातील, 6-8 वर्गाचा असेल. दुय्यम टप्पा - हे 14-19 वर्षे वयोगटातील वर्ग 9-12 चा समावेश असेल. ही चार वर्षे बहु-विद्याशाखीय अभ्यासासाठी निवडीशी जोडली जातील. केवळ एकाच शाखेत अभ्यास करणे आवश्यक नाही.

विद्यार्थ्यांना फक्त तीन वेळा म्हणजे 3, 5 आणि 8वी वर्गात परीक्षा द्याव्या लागतात.

विद्यार्थ्यांच्या कामगिरीचे मूल्यमापन करण्यासाठी "पारख" ही एक मूल्यांकन संस्था स्थापन करावी लागेल. विरष्ठ महाविद्यालयीन प्रोग्राम हा लवचिक एक्झिटसह 4 वर्षांचा कार्यक्रम असेल. एक वर्षांचा अभ्यासक्रम प्राप्त केल्याने प्रमाणपत्र दिले जाईल, 2-वर्षे डिप्लोमा पदवी, 3-वर्षे पदवीसह, आणि 4-वर्षे संशोधन कार्य आणि अभ्यास केलेल्या विषयाशी संबंधित शोधांशी एकत्रित केले जातील.

उच्च शिक्षण अनुदान परिषद (HEGC) विद्यापीठे आणि महाविद्यालयांना निधी आणि वित्तपुरवठा करण्यासाठी. हे AICTE आणि UGC ची जागा घेईल. NEET आणि JEE आयोजित करण्याबरोबरच विद्यापीठे आणि महाविद्यालयांसाठी सामाईक प्रवेशद्वार ठेवण्याची जबाबदारी राष्ट्रीय चाचणी संस्थेची आहे. मास्टर ऑफ फिलॉसॉफी अभ्यासक्रम बंद करण्यात येणार आहे, कारण हा मास्टर्स आणि पीएच.डी दरम्यानचा इंटरमीडिएट कोर्स होता. नॅशनल रिसर्च फाउंडेशन (NRA) संशोधन आणि नवकल्पनांना चालना देण्यासाठी विकसित केले जाईल. परदेशी विद्यापीठांनी आपले कॅम्पस आपल्या देशात आणि त्याउलट सेट करावेत.

शिक्षकांचे शिक्षण आणि भरती 4 वर्षांच्या एकात्मिक B.Ed कार्यक्रमामुळे ते अध्यापनासाठी आवश्यक झाले. विविध अध्यापन साधनांबाबत शिक्षकांच्या प्रशिक्षणासाठी कार्यशाळा आयोजित केल्या पाहिजेत. शिक्षक भरती प्रक्रियेतील पारदर्शकता ही विद्यार्थ्यांच्या विकासासाठी केंद्रीकृत भूमिका असते.

नवीन शैक्षणिक धोरणाचे फायदेशीर परिणाम हे शिकणाऱ्याच्या आत्म-क्षमतेवर, संज्ञानात्मक कौशल्यांवर ताण देते. जर मुलामध्ये जन्मजात प्रतिभा असेल तर ते त्यांच्या कौशल्यांचा विकास करण्यास मदत करेल.

पूर्वी विद्यार्थ्यांना अभ्यासासाठी फक्त एकच विषय निवडण्याचा पर्याय होता पण आता वेगवेगळे विषय निवडू शकतात, उदाहरणार्थ – गणितासह कला आणि हस्तकला निवडू शकतात.

प्रत्येक विषयाला समानतेने हाताळण्यावर भर. विद्यार्थ्यांमध्ये नाविन्यपूर्ण कल्पना रुजवून परस्परसंवादाची शक्ती, टीकात्मक विचार आणि तर्क करण्याची क्षमता विकसित करणे हा मुख्य हेतू आहे.

बॅचलर कोर्सेसमधील एकाधिक एक्झिट पर्याय विद्यार्थ्यांना अनुभवाचा लाभ घेण्याची आणि दरम्यानच्या काळात कुठेतरी काम करून कौशल्य प्राप्त करण्याची आणि नंतर पुढे शिक्षण चालू ठेवण्याची संधी प्रदान करेल.

नवीन शैक्षणिक धोरण कोणताही विषय शिकण्याच्या व्यावहारिक पैलूवर लक्ष केंद्रित करते, कारण ती संकल्पना समजून घेण्याचा एक चांगला मार्ग मानला जातो. 2040 पर्यंत सर्व संस्था आणि उच्च शिक्षण संस्था बहुविद्याशाखीय बनतील.

नवीन शैक्षणिक धोरण अनेक उपक्रमांसह मांडले गेले आहे जे सध्याच्या परिस्थितीची खरोखर गरज आहे. हे धोरण अभ्यास, अभ्यासक्रमासह कौशल्य विकासावर लक्ष देण्याशी संबंधित आहे. कोणत्याही गोष्टीची नुसती स्वप्ने पाहिल्याने ते साध्य होणार नाही, कारण योग्य नियोजन करून त्याप्रमाणे काम केल्यास उद्दिष्ट पूर्ण होण्यास मदत होईल. NEP ची उद्दिष्टे जितक्या लवकर साध्य होतील तितक्या लवकर आपल्या देशाला प्रगतीकडे नेतील.

காந்தி அவர்கள் தென்னாபிரிக்காவின் பிரிட்டோரியா ரயிலில் ஏறிய காந்தி அவர் வெள்ளையர் இல்லை என்பதற்காக தூக்கி வீசபட்டார். அந்த ரயில் நிலையத்தில் காந்தியின் சிலை வைக்கப்பட்டுள்ளது. தென்னாபிரிக்காவின் கறுப்பின மக்களும் அங்கே குடி பெயர்ந்த இந்திய மக்களும் படும் பிரச்சனைகளை உணர்ந்தனர். அதனால் தென்னாப்பிரிக்காவில் இந்தியர்களின் வாக்குரிமையை நிறுத்தும் தீர்மானத்தை எதிர்த்தார். 1894 -ல் தென்னாப்பிரிக்காவில் நாட்டல் இந்திய காங்கிரஸ் எனும் கட்சியை ஆரம்பித்தார். அதில் அவரே தலைமையாக வகித்தார். அறவழி போராட்டத்தின் மூலம் தென்னாபிரிக்காவில் வாழும் இந்தியர்களின் சமூக நிலையை உயர்த்தி அவரது முயற்சியில் வெற்றியை கண்டார். சுதந்திர போராட்டத்தில் வீரர் காந்தியின்

இந்தியாவில் தனது மக்கள் அடிமைப்படுவதை கண்டு கவலை அடைந்தார். இதனால் இந்திய தேசிய காங்கிரஸ் கட்சியில் இணைந்து ஆங்கிலேயருக்கு எதிரான விடுதலை போராட்டத்தில் முழுமையாக ஈடுபட்டார். 1924 -ல் இந்திய தேசிய காங்கிரஸின் தலைவராக பொறுப்பேற்றார். காங்கிரஸில் பல மாற்றங்களை காந்தி ஏற்படுத்தினார். இவர் முதலில் விவசாயிகளுக்கான சம்பாரண் போராட்டத்தை தொடங்கினார். 1930 -ல் 240 மைல் நடைபயணம் இந்திய வரலாற்றில் உப்பு சத்தியாகிரகம் என்று சொல்லப்படுகிறது.

1942 -ல் ஆங்கிலேயர்களுக்கு எதிராக வெள்ளையனே வெளியேறு போராட்டத்தில் காந்தி பெரும் பங்களிப்பு ஆற்றினார். 1947 -ல் இந்தியா சுதந்திரம் அடைய முக்கியமான ஒருவராக காந்தி இருந்தார்.

காந்திக்கு இரவீந்திரநாத் தாகூர் மகாத்மா என்ற பட்டத்தை வழங்கினர்.

"இளைஞர்களே கனவு காணுங்கள், இந்திய எதிர்காலம் உங்கள் கைகளில் தான் உள்ளது" என்கிற இந்த உத்வேக வரியை நம் நாட்டு இளைஞர்களுக்கு வழங்கியவர் மறைந்த ஏவுகணைத் தொழில் நுட்ப விஞ்ஞானியும், இந்திய நாட்டின் முன்னாள் ஜனாதிபதியும் திரு ஏ.பி.ஜே. அப்துல் கலாம் ஆவார். இன்றளவும் இந்திய இளைஞர்களின் ஆதர்ச நாயகனாக விளங்கும் திரு. அப்துல் கலாம் அவர்கள் குறித்த ஒரு கட்டுரை(Abdul kalam katturai in Tamil) இதோ.

அப்துல் கலாம் 1931 ஆம் ஆண்டு அக்டோபர் மாதம் 15 ஆம் தேதி தமிழ்நாட்டில் இருக்கின்ற ராமநாதபுரம் மாவட்டத்தில் இருக்கின்ற புகழ்பெற்ற ஆன்மிக தலமான ராமேஸ்வரம் நகரத்தில் பாரம்பரியமிக்க இஸ்லாமிய குடும்பத்தில் பிறந்தார். இவரது தந்தை பெயர் ஜைனலாப்தீன், தாயார் பெயர் ஆயிஷாமாஎன்பதாகும். இவருக்கு நான்கு சகோதரர்கள் மற்றும் ஒரு சகோதரி இருந்தனர்.

அப்துல் கலாமின் தந்தை ஜைனுலாபுதீன் ராமேஸ்வரத்திற்கு வருகின்ற பக்தர்களை தனுஷ்கோடி என்கிற இடத்திற்கும், ராமேஸ்வரத்திற்கு படகில் சென்று அழைத்து வரும் படகுகளை சொந்தமாக வைத்து தொழில் நடத்தினார். பூர்வீகத்தில் மிகவும் செல்வந்த குடும்பமாக இருந்தாலும் அப்துல்கலாம் அவர் பிறக்கின்ற சமயம் அவர்களின் குடும்பம் மிகுந்த வறுமை நிலையை அடைந்திருந்தது. குடும்பத்தின் வறுமை நிலையைப் போக்க அப்துல் கலாம் தனது பள்ளி நேரம் முடிந்து பகுதி நேரத்தில் செய்தித்தாள்களை விற்பனை செய்து வருமானம் ஈட்டி தனது குடும்பத்திற்கு உதவியாக இருந்தார்.

அப்துல் கலாம் பள்ளி, கல்லூரி படிப்பு தனது பள்ளிப் படிப்பில் சராசரி மாணவனாகவே இருந்த திரு. அப்துல்

கலாம் பள்ளிப்படிப்பு முடிந்த பிறகு திருச்சி மாவட்டத்தில் உள்ள பிரபலமான செயின்ட் ஜோசப் கல்லூரியில் இயற்பியல் துறையை தேர்ந்தெடுத்து படித்தார். 1954 ஆம் ஆண்டு இயற்பியல் படித்து முடித்து பட்டம் பெற்ற திரு அப்துல்கலாம் அவர்கள் தனக்கு இயற்பியலில் ஆர்வம் இல்லை என்பதை உணர்ந்து, தனது சிறு வயது கனவான போர் விமானி ஆகும் முயற்சிகளை மேற்கொண்டார்.

எனினும் போர் விமானி ஆவதற்கான தகுதி தேர்வில் அவர் சில மதிப்பெண்கள் குறைவாக எடுத்ததால், அவரின் அந்த லட்சியம் நிறைவேறாமல் போனது. எனினும் 1955 ஆம் ஆண்டு சென்னை குரோம்பேட்டையில் உள்ள எம்.ஐ.டி தொழில் கல்வி நிறுவனத்தில் "விண்வெளி பொறியியல்" படிப்பை தேர்ந்தெடுத்து படித்தார். பின்னர் அதே கல்லூரியில் தனது முதுகலைப் பட்டத்தையும் படித்து முடித்தார்.

அப்துல் கலாம் விஞ்ஞானி பணி – அப்துல் கலாம் கண்டுபிடிப்ப தனது பட்டப்படிப்பை முடித்த பிறகு 1960 ஆம் ஆண்டு திரு. அப்துல் கலாம் மத்திய அரசின் நிர்வாகத்தின் கீழ் இயங்கும் பாதுகாப்பு ஆராய்ச்சி மற்றும் உற்பத்தி நிறுவனத்தில் விஞ்ஞானியாக பணியில் சேர்ந்தார். அங்கு "ஹோவர் கிராப்ட்" எனப்படும் நிலம் – நீரில் செல்லக்கூடிய வாகனத்தை உருவாக்கினார். சில காலத்தில் அப்பொழுது இந்தியாவின் புகழ்பெற்ற விண்வெளி அறிவியலாளராக இருந்த திரு. விக்ரம் சாராபாய் அவர்களின் நேரடி வழிக்காட்டுதல் மற்றும் தலைமையின் கீழ் பணிபுரியும் வாய்ப்பைப் அப்துல் கலாம் பெற்றார்.

1963 முதல் 1964 வரை திரு. அப்துல்கலாம் அமெரிக்காவின் விண்வெளி ஆய்வு நிறுவனமான நாசாவின் (NASA) தலைமையகம் மற்றும் ஏனைய விண்வெளி ஆய்வு தளங்களுக்கு சென்று பார்வையிட்டு இந்தியாவில் எத்தகைய விண்வெளி ஆய்வுகளை மேற்கொள்ள வேண்டும் என்பதற்கான திட்டங்களை வகுக்கார். இஸ்ரோவில் அப்துல் கலாம் – Abdul kalam katturai in Tamil 1969 ஆம் ஆண்டு இஸ்ரோ (ISRO) எனப்படும் இந்திய விண்வெளி ஆய்வு நிறுவனத்திற்கு பணி மாறுதல் செய்யப்பட்ட அப்துல் கலாம், இந்தியாவின் முதல் எஸ் எல் வி (S.L.V) எனப்படும் விண்வெளி ஏவுதள திட்ட

இயக்குனராக நியமிக்கப்பட்<mark>ட</mark>ார். விஞ்ஞானி அப்துல் கலாமின் கோரிக்கைக்கு ஏற்ப மேலும் பல விண்வெளி ஆய்வு விஞ்ஞான பொறியாளர்களை இஸ்ரோ நிறுவனத்தில் சேர்க்க அப்போதைய மத்திய அரசு ஒப்புதல் வழங்கியது.

இவரது தலைமையின் கீழ் ரோகிணி -1 (ROHINI – 1) எனப்படும் ஒரு செயற்கைக் கோள் 1980 ஆம் ஆண்டு விண்வெளியில் வெற்றிகரமாக ஏவப்பட்டது. இவரது இந்த சாதனை பாராட்டிய அப்போதைய மத்திய அரசு இவருக்கு 1981 ஆம் ஆண்டு "பத்ம பூஷன்" விருதை வழங்கி கௌரவித்தது. 1970கள் முதல் 1990 ஆண்டுகள் காலகட்டத்தில் இந்தியாவின் பி.எஸ்.எல்.வி எனப்படும் (PSLV) விண்வெளி திட்டங்களை வெற்றிகரமாக செயல்படுத்தினார்.

விண்வெளியில் ராக்கெட்டுகளை ஏவுவதில் மட்டுமே கவனம் செலுத்தி வந்த கலாம், இந்தியாவின் பாதுகாப்பிற்காக இந்த ராக்கெட் தொழில்நுட்பத்தை, எவகணை கொழில்நுட்பமாக மாற்றுவதற்கான முயற்சிகள் பற்றி அப்போதைய பிரதமரான இந்திரா காந்தி அவர்களிடம் விவரித்தார். இந்த ஏவுகணை திட்டத்திற்கான விவாதம் நாடாளுமன்றத்தில் நடைபெற்ற பொழுது, இந்த திட்டத்திற்கு கடும் எதிர்ப்பு கிளம்பி, திட்டம் கிடப்பில் போடப்பட்டது. எனினும் பிரதமர் இந்திரா காந்தி அவர்கள், தனக்கிருந்த சில சிறப்பு அதிகாரங்களை பயன்படுத்தி தேசத்தின் பாதுகாப்பிற்காக, அப்துல் கலாமின் ஏவுகணை திட்டத்திற்கு பல ரகசியமான முறைகளில் உதவிகள் செய்தார்.

இதன் காரணமாக அப்துல் கலாமின் கலைமையின் கீழ் இயங்கிய விஞ்ஞானிகளால் இந்தியாவின் பாதுகாப்பிற்கு ஒரு சேர்க்கும் வகையிலான "அக்னி" மற்றும் "பிரித்திவி"" ரக ஏவுகணைகள் உருவாக்கப்பட்டன. இதன் காரணமாகவே இவருக்கு 'ஏவுகணை நாயகன்" என்கிற ஒரு பட்டப் பெயரும் உண்டானது. அப்துல் கலாம் பற்றி 10 வரிகள் அப்துல்கலாமின் சாகனைகளில் மகுடமாக கருதப்படுவது 1998 ஆம் ஆண்டு அவர் தலைமையில் மேற்கொள்ளப்பட்ட அணுகுண்டு சோதனை தான். அந்த ஆண்டு மே மாதம் 11ஆம் தேதி ராஜஸ்தான் மாநிலத்தில் "பொக்ரான்" என்னுமிடத்தில் மேற்கொள்ளப்பட்ட அணுகுண்டு சோதனை இந்தியாவின் அணு ஆயுத பலத்தை உலகிற்கு

பறைசாற்றியது. இந்திய நாட்டின் விண்வெளி ஆய்வு, தேச பாதுகாப்பு மற்றும் ஏவுகணை தொழில்நுட்பத்தில் அவர் ஆற்றிய சிறப்பான பணிகளுக்காக திரு. அப்துல் கலாமுக்கு 1997 ஆம் ஆண்டு மத்திய அரசு "பாரத ரத்னா" விருது வழங்கி அவரை கௌரவித்தது. அப்துல் கலாம் இந்திய ஜனாதிபதி பதவி (Abdul kalam katturai in tamil) இந்தியாவின் மீது மிகுந்த பற்று கொண்ட அப்துல் கலாம், அரசியலில் பெரிய அளவு ஈடுபாடு இல்லாத நபராகவே இருந்தார். எனினும், அவர் மீது மதிப்பு கொண்ட அப்போதைய பிரதமர் திரு. வாஜ்பாய் அவர்களின் வேண்டுகோளை ஏற்று 2002 ஆம் ஆண்டு இந்திய ஜனாதிபதி தேர்தலில் போட்டியிட்டு வெற்றி பெற்றார். 2002 ஆம் ஆண்டு முதல் 2007ஆம் ஆண்டு வரை ஐந்து ஆண்டுகள் முழுவதும் இந்திய ஜனாதிபதியாக பதவி வகித்தார்.

பதவிக் காலத்தில் அவர் மேற்கொண்ட நடவடிக்கைகளால் அவருக்கும், அவர் வகித்த ஜனாதிபதிக்கும் இந்திய மக்களிடம் பெரும் மதிப்பு உண்டானது. 2007ஆம் ஆண்டு அவரின் பதவிக் காலம் முடிந்ததும் மீண்டும் இந்திய நாட்டின் ஜனாதிபதி தேர்தலில் போட்டியிட முயன்றார். எனினும் பல்வேறு காரணங்களால் அந்த போட்டியில் இருந்து விலகினார். திரு அப்துல் கலாம் அவர்கள் உலகெங்கிலும் பல்வேறு பல்கலைக்கழகங்கள் மற்றும் அரசாங்கங்களால் பல்வேறு விருதுகள் வழங்கப்பட்டு கௌரவிக்கப்பட்டுள்ளார். இதோ அந்த பட்டியல்.

APJ அப்துல் கலாம் வாழ்க்கை வரலாறு கட்டுரை அறிவியல் மட்டுமல்ல, ஆன்மீகத்திலும் மிகுந்த ஈடுபாடு கொண்டவராக அப்துல்கலாம் அவர்கள் விளங்கினார். இஸ்லாம் மதம் மட்டும் அல்லாது இந்து, ஜெயின, பௌத்த மற்றும் சீக்கிய மத கொள்கைகள், நூல்கள் போன்றவற்றை நன்கு கற்றறிந்தார். இசையில் மிகுந்த ஆர்வம் கொண்ட திரு.கலாம் அவர்கள் வீணை வாசிப்பதில் திறமையானவராக இருந்தார்.

குழந்தைகள் மீது தீராத அன்பு கொண்ட கலாம் அவர்கள் எங்கு சென்றாலும் அங்கும் பள்ளி மாணவர்களை சந்தித்து, அவர்களுடன் பேசி, அவர்களை உற்சாகப்படுத்துவதை வாடிக்கையாக கொண்டிருந்தார். தன்னுடைய விஞ்ஞான ஆய்வு வாழ்க்கைக்கு குடும்ப வாழ்க்கை ஒரு பாரமாக இருக்கும் என கருதிய கலாம் அவர்கள் இறுதி வரை திருமணம் செய்து கொள்ளாமல் வாழ்ந்தார்.


It is frequently stated that college life teaches you a lot of things. A lot of morals, a lot about of relationships, the importance of people and a lot more.......

Thinnai -The Verandah



This FDP and the word Thinnai a traditional social verandah during the interaction in one of the sessions made me name this page after it. One of my earliest memories of sitting in the thinnai growing up in Madras in the 1970s in a traditional architectural home with my Thatha, paati, (grandparents), is of evenings spent with them after a light dinner, lying on the thinnai - a raised veranda of with red oxide in front of the home — listening to stories from the Ramayana and the Mahabharata until I would fall asleep. It was a place that received ample breeze. A typical traditional South Indian home used to have a thinnai that ran along the outer boundary — a shaded verandah or sit-out space with built-in seating, usually at the entrance. This was where residents would meet up with neighbours, debate, read, gossip or just take a short nap. It was where my grandfather's friends would have a glass of water, (Neer-Mor) buttermilk or paanagam a traditional cooling drink offered by my grandmother, as they chatted with him. It facilitated social interactions and protected the house from the harsh sunlight. A social verandah which was cost-effective leaves behind a resilient form of elegance.

The thinnai was an apt place to enjoy a cup of coffee or watch the rain from. Women would stop passers-by for chatting, or ask vyabari (Hawkers) to unload their products. In our current, fast-paced lives, this traditional space and the interactions it engendered have gradually disappeared.

When I recall, the thinnai (in Tamil) in our house provided the necessary independence as well as privacy. In fact, thinnai was where the guests were asked to sit. If the visitor was a friend, he will sit out of the house in thinnai and chat. Sometimes, coffee used to be offered to him if he came at coffee time.

It was around 11 in the morning, and all the ladies at home were so relaxed, some women were chatting on the 'Thinnai'(cement benches), while some old men were seated under a stone platform under a tree and chatting. Just in front of my perimma's house was a square bench pattern on which all the ladies would assemble unofficially around 4 pm and chat their problems away.

Much before the Doordarshan days, my mom and her friends too after their household work would sit out and talk while they learnt to knit, sew and 'Can' foods like Vadams, appalams, pappadams, pickles and jams. They were like members of one big family. We have one such cement platform under the tangerine tree in the backyard of our Grand mom's house too at Kaladakurichi. Neighbours come and chat with our household members.

The conversations in all the above meetings would involve politics, movies, music, cuisine, latest trends, developments, job and alliances for their children, schooling etc... and most important they would share their personal problems, happiness, worries, sympathise and empathise with the other's feelings without being judgemental. Just listening and talking about their problems was so cathartic and de-stressing my mom, and periamma would say. As a child, I was an observer of these discussions.

Earlier, a lot of houses in Tamil Nadu used to have "Thinnai", something like a sit-out at the entrance of the house. In our old house, we used to have a Thinnai and a bench too where people used to sit and chill and have conversations. In our village, the doors of our houses are opened in the morning and closed only at night when the last family member wants to go to bed.

Even today, if you walk through the narrow lanes of traditional neighbourhoods of Triplicane or Mylapore of Chennai, Agraharams in tiruvanandapuram, coastal Karnataka, outskirts of cities in Andhra Pradesh and Telangana, you will see a few houses with thinnai.

Thinnai sessions are called by many names in many languages arrattai (Tamil), gappe(Hindi), gossip or respectfully I call it 'Group Discussion' or 'Hang out'. These talks create a bond of sharing, care, love and help among people.

In times of crisis, they also become a support sys-

tem like an extended family. She said all they do is take some personal time to listen to people's problems and they don't even give advice. Just talking, about their problems made them mentally lighter. Thinnai is a unique space that provides a sense of community and connection. A place where people can relax, socialize, and enjoy the outdoors.

The loss of the veranda is a sign of the changing nature of Indian society, but it is also a reminder of the importance of this space. The veranda is a transitional space that serves as a vital bridge between private and public life. It is a place where people can relax, socialize, and connect with their community. Unfortunately, in today's dense urban apartment development, we have lost a lot of the traditional architectural features that were an integral part of the streetscape and independent homes of yester-year.

The architecture of today has shifted from a social pattern that was inclusive of the local community to being more isolated and dependent on privacy, leaving no time (or spaces) for community social interaction at home in today's modern world and way of life.

However, even in apartments, spacious balconies and sit-outs can be made interesting and inviting and if located right, can definitely provide an experience at least somewhat reminiscent of the traditional 'thinnai'- a representation of life that was slow-paced, relaxed and yet profound. Today the traditional old thinnai slowly started disappearing and are replaced by the modern social verandah for the wealthier in turn; the spaces lost out on community interactions and a view of the streetscape.
